Why are we doing this RE-SOURCING virtual webinar?

The RE-SOURCING event brings together industry leaders, research organisations and every day users of technology in the area of responsible sourcing. The goal of this event is to provide aggregated information by experts on the topic of good practice cases showcasing successful implementation of responsible sourcing standards in industry and enable peer learning.

Will I get anything for taking part?

Your participation is entirely voluntary and does not include any form of compensation or other remuneration, now or in the future. The aim of your participation is to leave this webinar with in-depth knowledge on the successful implementation of responsible sourcing standards.

If I decide to take part, what personal data will be collected and who will receive the personal data I provide for which purposes?

First, your contact information (full name, email) will be collected when you join the Zoom Webinar. In terms of this contact information, the event organizer MUL is the controller of your data within the meaning of the GDPR.

Your contact information will be included in the RE-SOURCING project's newsletter subscription list. You can unsubscribe from the newsletter at any time by sending an email to the data controller, MUL, or selecting the 'Unsubscribe' button in the newsletter itself.

Second, the event will be video- and audio-recorded via Zoom for research purposes as well as outreach through the project's newsletter, website and social media channels, including promotional videos to inform the public about the results of this event. Due to the virtual format of the event and the technical restrictions of the conference and streaming platforms, please be aware that it is not possible to exclude individual persons from the recordings. However, you are free to disable your video function and use a pseudonym at any time in order to protect your identity. In terms of the film- and audio-records, MUL is the controller of the data within the meaning of the GDPR.

The data controller's address and contact (MUL) can be found at the end of this document. If you have any questions about data protection, you may also contact the responsible Data Protection Officer detailed at the end of this document.

Where will my data be stored?

Registration information (full name, email) is collected via *Zoom* where the data of your registration will be stored. *Additionally, your data is stored locally at MUL.*

Audio-/video recordings will be recorded via *Zoom* and stored locally at *Montanuniversität Leoben.*

The use of *Zoom Webinars* is subject to the privacy policy of *Zoom* available at <https://explore.zoom.us/en/trust/legal-compliance/>.

Who will have access to my personal data and the video and audio tape recorded during the workshop?

The contact information (full name, email) collected during the login process will not be publicly available, will not be shared with third parties (except members of the consortium where necessary) without your prior consent and are not attributed to any commercial use.

The video and audio tapes taken during the event will be used for research and outreach purposes and may be made publicly available fully or in part via the project's newsletter, website and social media channels. Please be aware that if you decide to share your real name and video on *Zoom*, this data may be published as part of the event recordings. However, you are free to disable your video function and use a pseudonym at any time in order to protect your identity.

When conducting research studies, it will not be revealed who has taken part in the event. If necessary or upon request by data subjects, different names may be used in other forms of publications such as reports so that readers will not be able to identify individual participants of the event.

How long will my data be stored?

Your personal contact data (full name, email) will be stored until five years after the end of the project in order to keep you updated on this and future events and will then be deleted.

What is the legal basis for the data processing?

Your contact information (full name, email, organization) will be processed on the basis of your explicit consent (see Art.6 (1) a GDPR) and due to the necessity to process this information for the performance of the event at your request via your registration (on the basis of Art 6 (1) b GDPR).

In addition, audio and video recordings of the event will be processed on the basis the legitimate interests pursued by the controller (i.e. research and outreach purposes), except where such interests are overridden by the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject which require protection of personal data, in particular where the data subject is a child (see Art 6 (1) f GDPR).

As regards scientific research, the data collected may be further used in accordance with Article 5 (1) d GDPR and Article 89 GDPR.

Which rights do I have as data subject?

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. A withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on GDPR Art. 6 (1) b, f; see the question above). It also does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent before its withdrawal.

At any time, you have the right to information about, access to and rectification of your personal data, restriction of data processing or erasure of personal data unless there is a lawful basis (see above), the right to data portability, the right to object, and the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority pursuant to the applicable statutory regulations (notably Art 15 - 22 GDPR).

Do I have to take part? Can I withdraw my participation?

It is your decision to decide whether you want to take part or not. If you agree to take part, you have the right to change your mind/pull out at any time and you do not have to explain why.

What are the possible risks in taking part?

There are no anticipated risks.

What do I need to do if I decide to take part in this RE-SOURCING event?

You are asked to read this information sheet and decide if – given this information – you would like to participate. If you decide to participate, please join via the provided Zoom link and enter your contact information.
